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The start of the full-scale war with Russia on **February 24, 2022**, has led to drastic life changes not for Ukrainians exclusively, but for the global community, as a whole. Multilateral relations, international aid from various countries and world organizations and the involvement of concerned foreigners have played a significant role in our struggle against the aggressor. Such global solidarity reflects a mutual understanding of the core principles that are at stake: democracy, freedom and the sovereignty of nations. This kind of unity and support underline the importance of international cooperation and the impact of taking collective measures in confronting challenges that threaten our shared values and security.

We understand that regardless of the existing danger, a considerable number of visitors still come to Ukraine, such as volunteers, public figures, activists, politicians, investors and many others. It demonstrates the ongoing support of Ukraine by the global community. BDO in Ukraine has taken an active stance on Ukraine's restoration activities and has significantly expanded its cooperation with the international community. During our communications we often receive questions from our partners about traveling to Ukraine safely. That is why we have decided to create this guide.

Developed by BDO in Ukraine, "**A Foreigner's Guide to Ukraine**" is a comprehensive resource for international visitors who are planning a journey to Ukraine amidst the chaos of war. This guide was crafted meticulously to provide you only with essential and actual information about traveling to Ukraine, safe accommodation during the war, obtaining insurance against military actions, as well as offering a whole array of useful resources, applications and tips to make your stay in Ukraine as safe as possible.

Ukraine is a vibrant country which consists of 24 regions, along with the Autonomous Republic of Crimea. Most of the regions, such as Kyiv, Lviv, Vinnytsia, Volyn, Dnipropetrovsk, Zhytomyr, Zakarpattia, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kirovohrad,

Odesa, Mykolaiv, Poltava, Sumy, Rivne, Khmelnytskyi, Ternopil, Cherkasy, Chernivtsi, and Chernihiv are firmly under Ukrainian control.

However, it is also important to note that currently some significant parts of Kherson, Zaporizhzhia, Donetsk, Luhansk and Kharkiv regions, as well as the Autonomous Republic of Crimea, are not under the full control of Ukrainian government. Due to such circumstances, traveling and presence in these territories is not possible. Additionally, for safety reasons we strongly recommend against traveling to or staying in towns and cities near the front line.

Visiting the western parts of the country, such as Zakarpattia, Ivano-Frankivsk, Chernivtsi and Ternopil regions is generally considered as safe, while Kyiv has the largest number of air defense systems, which cover the sky above the city from air raids and other attacks.

We put our trust in the **Armed Forces of Ukraine** and we hope for a swift return of Ukraine's sovereign territory to its legal borders. For travelers looking to explore Ukraine safely an [up-to-date interactive front-line map](#) is available to identify areas securely under Ukrainian governance.

The area of Ukraine compared to other countries

Ukraine and Europe

Ukraine is the largest country entirely within Europe, covering approximately **603,628 sq km**.

It is larger than **France** (551,695 sq km) and almost twice the size of **Germany** (357,578 sq km).

Ukraine's area is about **70%** of the combined area of the **United Kingdom** and **Italy**.

The area of Ukraine is almost **20** times the area of **Belgium** (30,688 sq km) or **5** times the area of **Greece** (131,957 sq km).



Ukraine and USA

Ukraine's land area is slightly smaller (about 15%) than **Texas**, which is **695,662 sq km**.

It is roughly the same size as the combined area of **New York**, **Pennsylvania**, **Ohio**, **Indiana**, and **Illinois**.

Ukraine and Australia

Ukraine is smaller than the Australian state of **Queensland** (1.853 mln sq km) but larger than **Victoria** (237,659 sq km).

Ukraine's area is approximately **8%** of the entire **Australian continent**, which is 7.692 mln sq km.



Safe transportation

Considering the current conditions that **direct air connections to Ukraine are temporarily unavailable**, we would like to reassure you that there are still several convenient and safe alternatives to get to Ukraine. From any corner of the Globe, access to the country remains open through a network of international gateways. You can select a flight to one of the airports near Ukrainian borders. Upon arrival you will find some easy traveling options, including train or bus connections, to transport you into Ukraine. Alternatively, if there is a direct connection with Ukraine you could choose a direct train or bus departing from one of the European countries, or you may consider driving to Ukraine by car as another option.

It's important to plan such journeys with a clear understanding of the current situation and to keep informed about the latest travel advisories and safety guidelines.

Rules for crossing the Ukrainian border

To cross the border with Ukraine being a resident of another country, you will need the following documents:

- ▶ A valid passport (Citizens of Turkey and Georgia can enter Ukraine on the basis of an ID card; Moldova ID-card valid for people living within 30 km (19 mi) border zone)
- ▶ An entry visa, if required (Information on the regime of entry for foreigners into Ukraine can be checked on the [MFA of Ukraine website](#))
- ▶ A residence permit, even those expired after February 24, 2022, grant the right to enter Ukraine
- ▶ A health insurance policy. Insurance in Ukraine is obligatory

Travel advisory for Ukraine

Travel advisory for Ukraine is at the **highest alert level (4)**, with many countries advising against all travel due to the ongoing war. The situation remains volatile, with risks from combat, shelling, and missile attacks. Travelers are urged to avoid frontline regions and areas near the borders with Russia and Belarus. While western regions have a slightly lower risk, the overall recommendation is to reconsider travel plans. Despite the risks, many continue to visit Ukraine for humanitarian, business, and personal reasons.

Below is information about some countries. Please visit the website of your country's embassy in Ukraine (or another government institution) to check the travel advisory for Ukraine.



United States of America

Instead of **Level 4 (do not travel)** for the entire country, **9 Ukrainian regions** (Volyn, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Zakarpattia, Ivano-Frankivsk, Rivne, Ternopil, Khmelnytsky and Zhytomyr) are now classified as **Level 3 (reconsider travel)** - with **lower risk**. This greatly facilitates visits to Ukraine by U.S. businesses, organizations and institutions.

This is also the de facto lift of ban on U.S. defense contractors from working in Ukraine, which opens up great opportunities for new UA - USA joint ventures in Ukraine.

Other regions of Ukraine still remain under a **Level 4** travel advisory. [Details](#)



Canada

The Canadian government also maintains a **high-level (4) travel advisory** against travel to Ukraine, citing significant risks from missile and drone strikes on civilian and government infrastructure. [Details](#)



United Kingdom

The Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) advises against all but essential travel (**Level 3**) to the following regions in western Ukraine: all parts of Zakarpattia, Ivano-Frankivsk, Ternopil, Chernivtsi, Lviv and areas more than 50 km from the border with Belarus: Volyn, Rivne and Zhytomyr. To other parts of Ukraine, the FCDO advises against all travel - **Level 4**. [Details](#)



Germany

The German government advises against travel to Ukraine (**Level 4**). Germans are strongly urged to leave the country if it is safe to do so. [Details](#)



Belgium

Travel to the entire territory of Ukraine is not recommended (**Level 4**). If you nevertheless choose to travel, it is at your own risk and responsibility. [Details](#)



Netherlands

The travel advisory for Dutch citizens to the entire territory of Ukraine is not recommended (**Level 4**). Any travel to Ukraine is highly discouraged and entirely at your own risk. [Details](#)



Travel by train

There are several options for visiting Ukraine by train. You can get to Ukraine from one of these countries:

Each of these countries has established train routes that connect directly with major Ukrainian cities providing travelers with a reliable and comfortable mode of transportation.

We recommend choosing this option for traveling to Ukraine to ensure a more predictable travel time.

It's important to check all information close to your departure date to ensure you have the latest updates. Please be aware of possible delays on all routes and allow additional time for passport control in Przemyśl before departure. Plan your connecting train accordingly.

In order to guarantee a seamless journey, we recommend planning your route straight from the airport. For example, the two most popular routes are:

1. From Warsaw Chopin Airport to the train stations:

Warsaw Chopin Airport has a train station, **Warszawa Lotnisko Chopina**, that is directly connected to the terminal. You can reach the station easily by following the signs at the airport. Alternative modes of transportation from the airport are taxis, cars or public transport, such as **the bus №175 or train S2, S3** to the **Warsaw Central** train station (from Chopin Airport - Arrivals to Dworzec Centralny).

2. From Rzeszów airport to Przemyśl train station

You can reach the train station by taxi or using public transportation such as buses or trains. In Poland, it's convenient to use a traditional taxi service (like **Uber**, **Bolt**) or the [GetTransfer](#) service.

**On November 8t, 2023, a new update for the Ukrzaliznytsia app was released, which became integrated with the Diia app.*

Now, purchasing tickets for the popular international train No. 67/68 Kyiv - Warsaw or returning tickets bought online for international routes is possible only after verifying your account through Diia. This change was introduced to fight ticket scalping. However, foreigners or individuals who do not have the Diia app will not be able to use these new features. It is advised that foreigners (or Ukrainian citizens) without Diia, who need to buy a ticket for this train, seek assistance from acquaintances who are Ukrainian citizens with the Diia app installed, or use alternative connections.

To buy tickets on the [Ukrzaliznytsia website](#), you must Log in using your mobile number for verification. This service is available only for users in selected countries, which include 27 EU countries, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Canada, Iceland, Liechtenstein, North Macedonia, Moldova, Monaco, Montenegro, Serbia, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, the UK and the USA.

Ticket refunds

Temporarily, **refunds for unused travel /transportation tickets** for international travel purchased through electronic communication channels are processed through a **claim procedure at international ticket offices in Ukraine.**

Passengers abroad may instruct an authorized person in Ukraine to submit an application and a hard copy of the boarding document in order to claim refund of payments for unused electronic travel documents before the departure of the train.

Also, starting from February 2024, passengers have the option to issue a claim for ticket refund online. To do this, you need to fill out an electronic application form and sign it using **Diia.Signature** (this option is available only to passengers who have Diia.Signature — Ukrainian citizens and foreigners who have an E-residence permit for permanent or temporary residence).

Applications for **group transportation** are available for groups of **10 or more people** and are accepted **exclusively ONLINE**. This can be done **up to 35 days** before the travel date, but **no later than 10 days** before the train's departure.



Travel by bus / by car

Currently, there are **42 open automobile checkpoints in Ukraine**, allowing you to choose the most convenient transportation option for you, whether it's by bus or by car. This network of crossing points offers both flexibility and convenience for travelers.

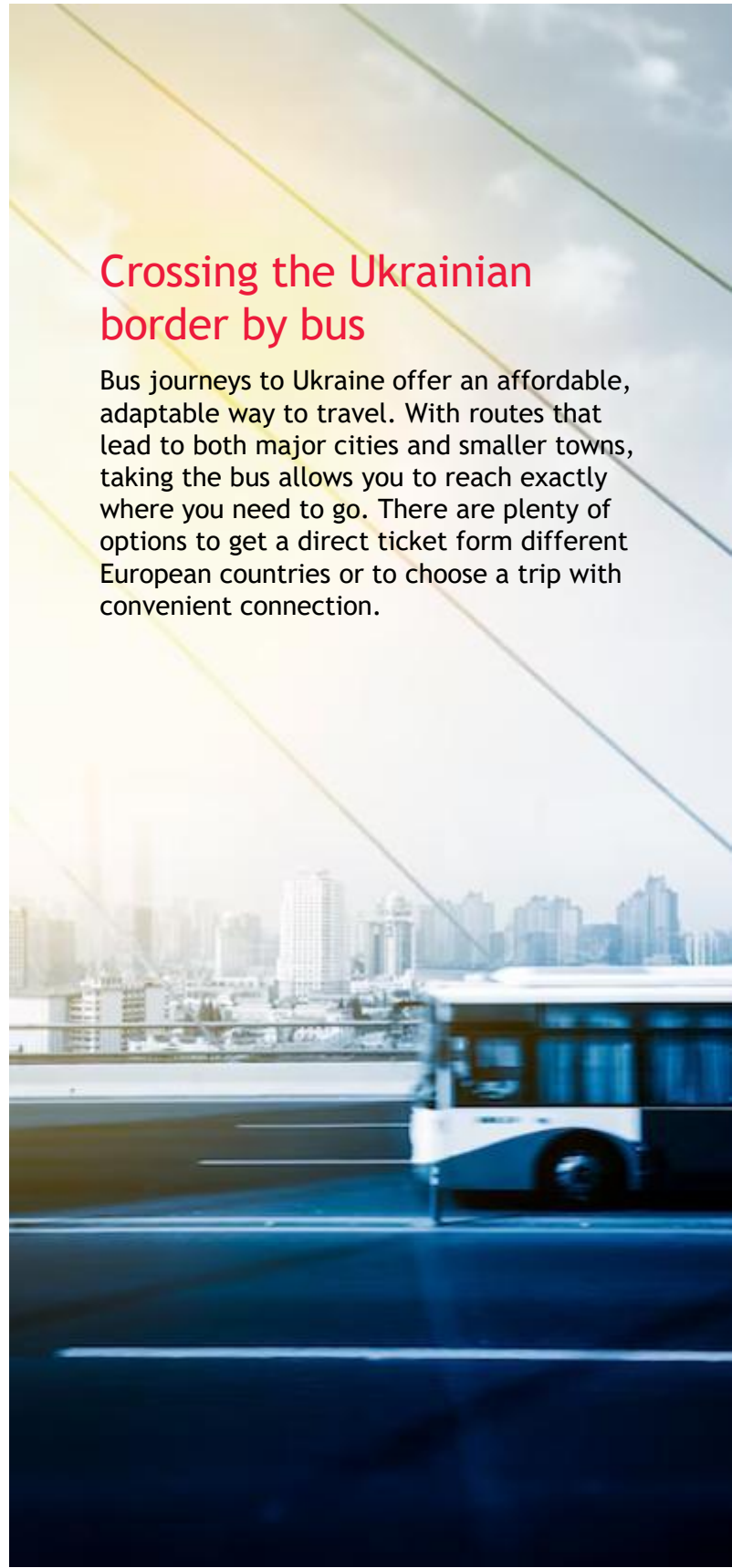

- ▶ Narcotic and psychotropic substances
- ▶ Strong poisons, radioactive and explosive substances
- ▶ Printed materials, film negatives, photographs, cinematographic films, video recordings, computer data storage media, manuscripts, records, and other materials that propagate war, racism, racial discrimination, and genocide, or undermine Ukraine's territorial integrity, political independence and sovereignty
- ▶ Pornographic materials
- ▶ Goods imported in violation of intellectual property rights.

Customs authorities in Ukraine play a crucial role in regulating the movement of goods across the country's borders. They enforce restrictions and **prohibitions on certain items based on Ukrainian law and international agreements** to ensure national security, protect public health, and preserve cultural values.

Goods Prohibited for Export from Ukraine

- ▶ Military weapons of all types, ammunition, and military equipment
- ▶ Narcotic and psychotropic substances
- ▶ Strong poisons, radioactive and explosive substances
- ▶ Works of art, cultural and historical valuables (paintings, sculptures, engravings, miniatures, porcelain, ceramics, precious and non-precious metals, folk art items, antiques, books, manuscripts, musical instruments, stamps, etc.)
- ▶ Canceled security
- ▶ Goods exported in violation of intellectual property rights.

Under Ukrainian law, the import of foreign cash currency into Ukraine is generally unrestricted.

Only the amount (**10,000 euros**) that can be imported without written declaration is limited.

Therefore, individuals entering Ukraine can transport cash currency and bank metals across the Ukrainian customs border without written declaration to the customs authority, up to an equivalent of 10,000 euros in value.

If the amount equals or exceeds the equivalent of 10,000 euros, written declaration is required, meaning a customs declaration must be filled out at the border. It's often misunderstood whether to declare the full amount or only the amount exceeding 10,000 euros. It should be understood that the full amount needs to be declared.

Goods Prohibited for Transit Through Ukraine

- ▶ Weapons and ammunition of all types and military equipment
- ▶ Aircraft, their parts, accessories, and equipment
- ▶ Machines and tools for manufacturing weapons, ammunition, and aircraft, as well as their spare parts
- ▶ Narcotic substances
- ▶ Radioactive items and substances
- ▶ Strong poisons and explosives, and other items that may harm health or threaten the life of the population and wildlife or cause environmental destruction.

Crossing the Ukrainian border by car

There is no prohibition to enter Ukraine by car with foreign license plates. Citizens of other countries may import cars with foreign registration number into Ukraine for personal use only. There are no customs fees associated with importing such vehicles.

However, there are restrictions on the duration of use for cars with foreign license plates in Ukraine. Vehicles without Ukrainian registration can stay in the country for up to one year. If the car stays in Ukraine longer than two months, it is necessary to obtain a **temporary registration at the Ministry of Internal Affairs service center**. Upon expiry of the one-year period, a car with foreign license plates are required to leave Ukraine.



Plan your travels with extra time in mind, as crossing borders may take longer than expected due to unforeseen delays. Be prepared with essentials like food, water, warm clothing and power banks for your devices.

Travel inside Ukraine

For traveling inside Ukraine, you have the options of taking a **train**, a **bus** or a **car**. There are no restrictions on travel for the most part in Ukraine. However, additional security measures may be in place in cities close to the front line.

Entry into the war zone is allowed only with special permission.

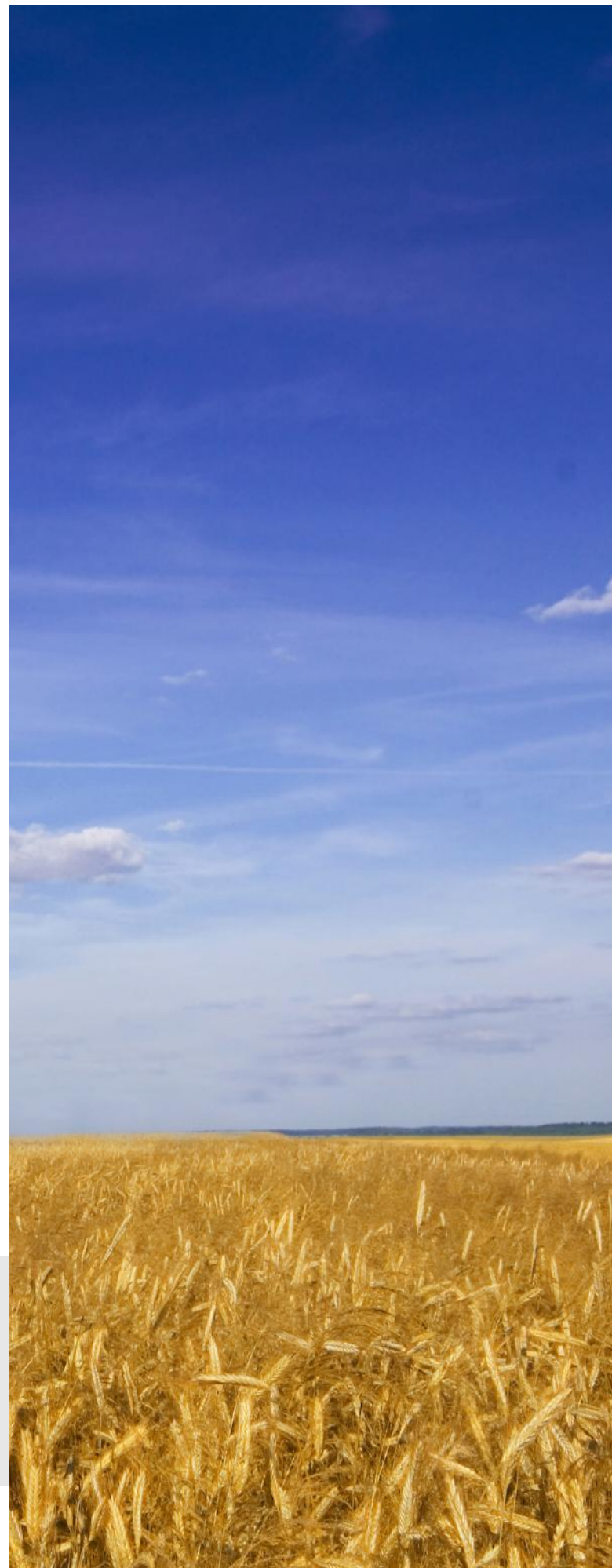
While moving inside Ukraine, upon entering and exiting cities there are checkpoint block posts. Before crossing the checkpoint, it is necessary to:

- ▶ Reduce the speed of the car;
- ▶ Prepare the documents for inspection in advance;
- ▶ Turn off the car headlights;
- ▶ Not to take photos or videos;
- ▶ Not to leave the car without permission;
- ▶ Open the trunk of the car on demand;
- ▶ After the permission to continue driving, do so without sudden acceleration;
- ▶ Keep calm and show mutual respect.

Therefore, in order to protect yourself from possible problems and misunderstandings when crossing the checkpoint you should not forget to take your ID documents with you.

There are no restrictions on moving around the city in most cities of Ukraine.

In Ukraine, it is prohibited to photograph or film missile strikes and their consequences, the movement of military personnel, weapons and equipment, and post them on social networks. This may be considered subject to criminal liability.



City transportation

Alleviate the complexities of urban transit in Ukrainian cities amidst the ongoing war. There are no restrictions on moving around for most of the cities.

Public Transport

Ukrainian public transportation systems, namely, buses, trolleybuses, trams and metro (available in **Kyiv**, **Kharkiv** and **Dnipro**), have adapted to wartime conditions by adjusting their operation hours and routes to ensure the safety of passengers and personnel.

Metro stations in Kyiv and Kharkiv have become symbols of safety and resilience. During air raid alerts, citizens seek shelter in these underground stations, equipped to protect people against aerial attacks. The deep construction of many of Kyiv's metro stations, some even among the deepest in the world, make them particularly suitable for this purpose. All underground metro stations **serve as shelters 24/7**. Simultaneously, the metro continues to offer essential public transportation services.

Trains operate between underground stations, ensuring the city's functionality even during times of crisis. **During air raid sirens, ground-level stations are out of service**. In **Kyiv**, these include **Red Line** metro stations: Dnipro, Hydropark, Livoberezhna, Darnytsia, Chernihivska and Lisova. Additionally, on the **Green Line**, trains do not operate across the left and right banks of the Dnipro River (between the Vidubichy and Slavutich stations).

Buses and trolleybuses are available in all major cities, while some cities also provide tram services. In towns, transportation is provided mainly by buses, commonly known in Ukraine as "**Marshrutka**".

You can use **Google Maps** or the [EasyWay](#) platform/ app to find for the most convenient route and type of transport to reach your destination.

However, remember that the closer you are to the front line, the stricter the rules become. Each city offers a plenty of options for public transportation, including **buses**, **trolleybuses**, **trams**, **city trains**, **metro services** and **taxis**.

Taxi

A convenient kind of travel for the big cities is the taxi service. In Ukraine, companies such as [Uber](#), [Bolt](#), [Uklon](#) are widespread, offering flexible and individual transportation options. These services have adapted to wartime conditions by implementing additional safety measures for both drivers and passengers.

Accommodation

While staying in Ukraine, living conditions are very important for a comfortable visit. There are plenty of options available in each Ukrainian city. We recommend checking whether the venue offers a **built-in shelter** or if it's **located close** to the place you have chosen before booking.

This selection of hotels will help you to choose from the array of accommodations, which offer excellent conditions and location and are **equipped with shelters and generators for constant access to electricity and communication, ensuring your safe stay in Ukraine.**



Kyiv

In Kyiv, the lively heart of Ukraine, you will find various accommodation choices, with hotels that continue operating, ensuring the safety and comfort of their guests. Today, Kyiv is the Ukrainian city most protected from air attacks, and the business life in the capital becomes more and more active each day.

We do not recommend planning trips to Odesa, Zaporizhzhia, Kherson, Mykolaiv, Kharkiv, Chernihiv and Sumy due to close proximity to the frontline and regular air raid attacks.

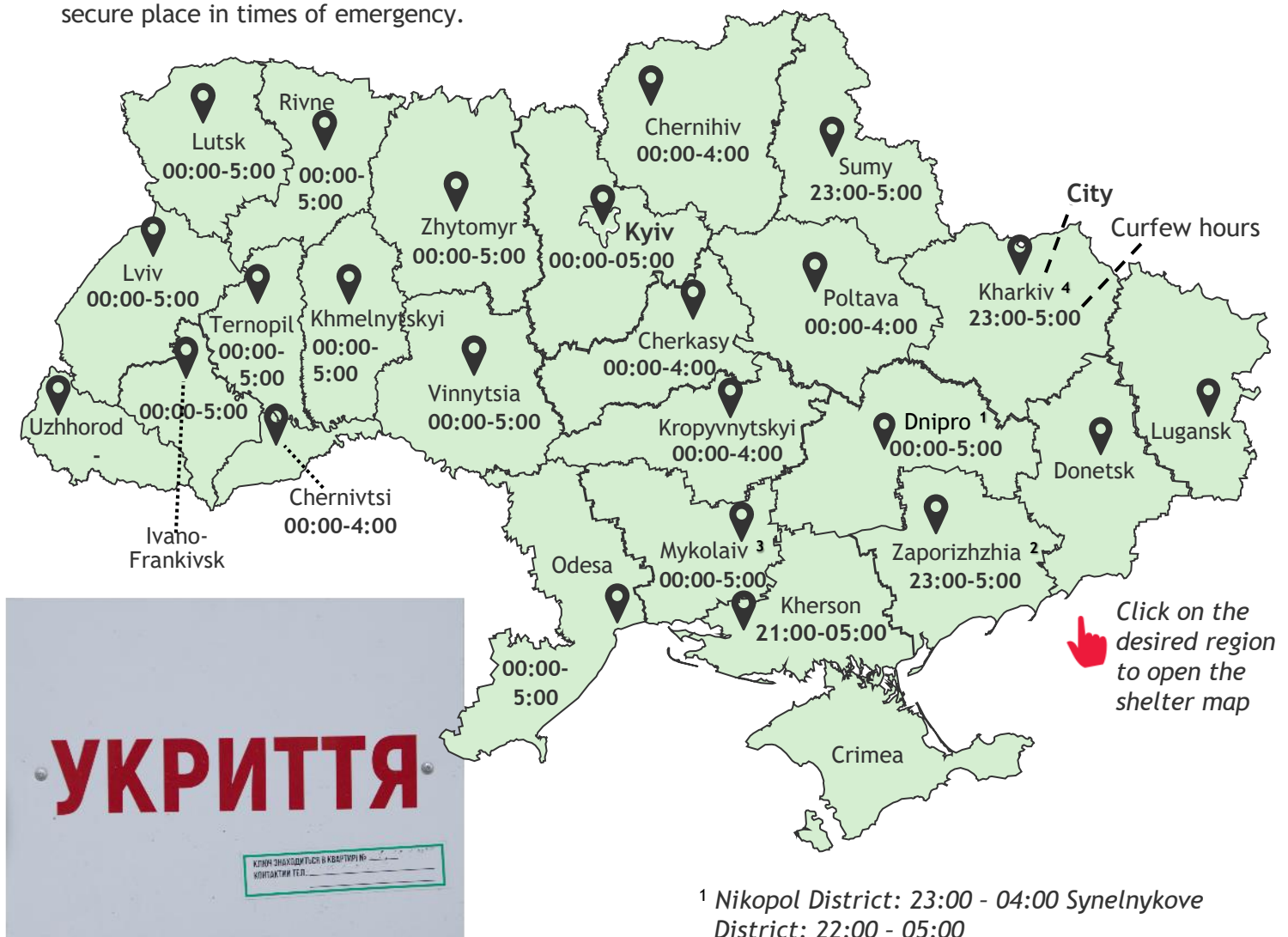
It's crucial to understand that safety of a hotel or district that you stay in does not correlate with the frequency of attacks; no area is completely safe. Thus, the most critical factor when selecting a place to stay is the availability of an easy access to shelters.



Shelters & Curfew map

In situations where every second counts, knowledge about the exact location of the nearest shelter can save lives and reduce the risk of injuries. A map of **shelters** (Ukrainian: "Укриття", romanized: "Ukryttya") contains critically important information, especially for the regions with active military actions. It provides essential details about **the nearest safe locations**, allowing for a quick access and relocation to a secure place in times of emergency.

Please be warned that **a curfew is in effect under the state of martial law in Ukraine**, and the movement restriction hours are indicated on the map per each region (be aware that the curfew varies by region). Regional centers are marked on the map as well, and the curfew regulations for the cities are also applied to the entire region.

Points of Invincibility

Points of Invincibility (Ukrainian: "Пункт незламності", romanized: "Punkt nezlamnosti") is a project initiated by the Ukrainian authorities in November 2022 in response to the extensive shelling of critical infrastructure by Russia.

Currently, throughout Ukraine, there are no scheduled power outages. However, if they occur, you can find the outage schedules for major cities and their regions via the links below.

In the event of new shelling of energy facilities, emergency power outages may be implemented until the situation stabilizes. In such cases, Points of Invincibility have been established in all cities and most villages in Ukraine, which can be used by anyone if necessary. These Points provide essential services such as heat, water, electricity, and mobile communication, and they operate **24/7** during these periods **completely free of charge**.

Additionally, you can use [Telegram](#) or [Viber](#) bots, where you need to enter address or share your geolocation, and the bot will provide a list of the nearest Points (*information currently available only in Ukrainian*).

We recommend noting down the addresses of the nearest Points in advance in case you cannot use the location search in an emergency.



Try to keep your phone and other devices charged at all times, and we recommend carrying a power bank with you.

Food & Shopping

Although the war continues and shelling remains a threat across all of Ukraine, many areas away from the front lines maintain a sense of normalcy. A wide variety of cafes, restaurants, supermarkets and shopping malls remain open and fully functional, offering residents and visitors access to daily essentials and vibrant culinary experiences.

Food

Some cafes and restaurants **may temporarily close during air alerts**, especially those located in shopping malls. Please keep this in mind when planning your visit.

Ukraine offers a wide variety of restaurants featuring diverse cuisines, including traditional **Ukrainian, Italian, Georgian, Japanese** and more. Many establishments also cater to vegetarians and offer business lunch menus starting from €5. Takeaway and delivery services are commonly available.

Most restaurants open around **10:00** or **11:00** and close by **22:00** (some staying open until **23:00**). These hours are influenced by the nationwide curfew, so it's a good idea to check in advance.

International fast-food chains such as **McDonald's** and **KFC** are widely available across Ukraine, particularly in relatively safe regions away from active war zones. McDonald's currently operates 109 restaurants in 36 cities, while KFC has around 60 locations.

Coffee culture in Ukraine is flourishing, with a wide variety of coffee shops offering drinks and treats to suit all tastes. Cozy cafes can be found throughout cities and towns, while coffee-to-go kiosks are popular and easily found, especially in city centers.

Delivery services is widely used in Ukraine. Many restaurants offer their own service and popular platforms like [Glovo](#), [Uber Eats](#) and [Bolt Food](#) provide convenient access to a wide range of cuisines.

Shopping

Ukraine's grocery sector is well-developed, with several major **supermarket** chains offering a wide range of products. For example:



ATB is the largest chain, with over 1,200 stores and a wide selection of affordable private-label products.



Silpo is a premium supermarket known for gourmet items, imported goods, and creatively themed store designs. It also offers private-label products.



Novus is a modern chain focused on fresh produce and international delicacies. Prices are slightly higher, but the selection is excellent.

Many large Silpo and Novus stores also feature ready-made meals and food court areas where you can dine on-site.

These chains are widely available in urban areas and support both in-store and online shopping. **Some supermarkets may close during air alerts, while others remain open.**

Shopping malls in Ukraine remain open and operational, especially in safer regions. They host a wide range of international and local brand stores, offering fashion, electronics, cosmetics and more.

During air alerts, malls temporarily close and all visitors are required to proceed to the nearest shelter. Despite these interruptions, malls continue to be popular destinations for shopping and leisure.



Insurance essentials

Medical insurance for foreigners **must be issued to every foreign citizen**, and this insurance policy is mandatory for entry and legal stay on the territory of Ukraine. It is highly recommended to obtain medical insurance that includes coverage for

military-related risks for the duration of your stay in Ukraine. Below you can explore a few medical insurance options from various Ukrainian companies and select the one that meets your needs the best.

Emergency contacts

Safety should be your top priority when traveling to Ukraine. These **important emergency contacts** will ensure that you can quickly reach the appropriate services in case of any urgent situations.

The unified emergency hotline number 112 serves the **central**, **western** and **eastern** macro-regions of Ukraine. A new center is set to launch in Odesa in 2025, extending coverage to the southern regions. Notably, the 112 line accommodates individuals with hearing or speech impairments as well, ensuring accessibility for all. Foreigners in Ukraine can call **112** or **911** and the call will be directed to the 112 Service.

Important to note: emergency numbers for specialized services **101**, **102**, **103**, and **104** operate **24/7** nationwide regardless of the specific emergency service number.

Keep this list handy and familiarize yourself with the local emergency procedures to stay prepared and safe throughout your journey.

As Ukraine is in a state of war and the enemy continuously shells its territory, there is a likelihood that you may encounter missile fragments or explosive devices, objects that threaten your life.

If you discover a **suspicious object**, do not attempt to:

- ▶ Move or roll it from one place to another
- ▶ Collect and store, heat, or strike it
- ▶ Attempt to discharge or disassemble it
- ▶ Make various items from it
- ▶ Use charges to start fires or for lighting
- ▶ Bring it indoors, bury it in the ground, or throw it into wells or rivers
- ▶ Take photos of finds and publish them on the Internet

Upon discovering a suspicious object, take measures to mark, fence, and guard the discovered items at the location. Immediately report this to the **local State Emergency Service (DSNS)** or the **Ministry of Internal Affairs (MVS)** by calling "101", "102" or "112".

Please note that exporting fragments of missiles, drones, and ammunition from Ukraine, even as souvenirs, is strictly prohibited.



We also recommend that you familiarize yourself with and have access to the contact details and location of your country's embassy in Ukraine. This can be crucial in case of emergencies or if you need assistance from your home country's representatives.

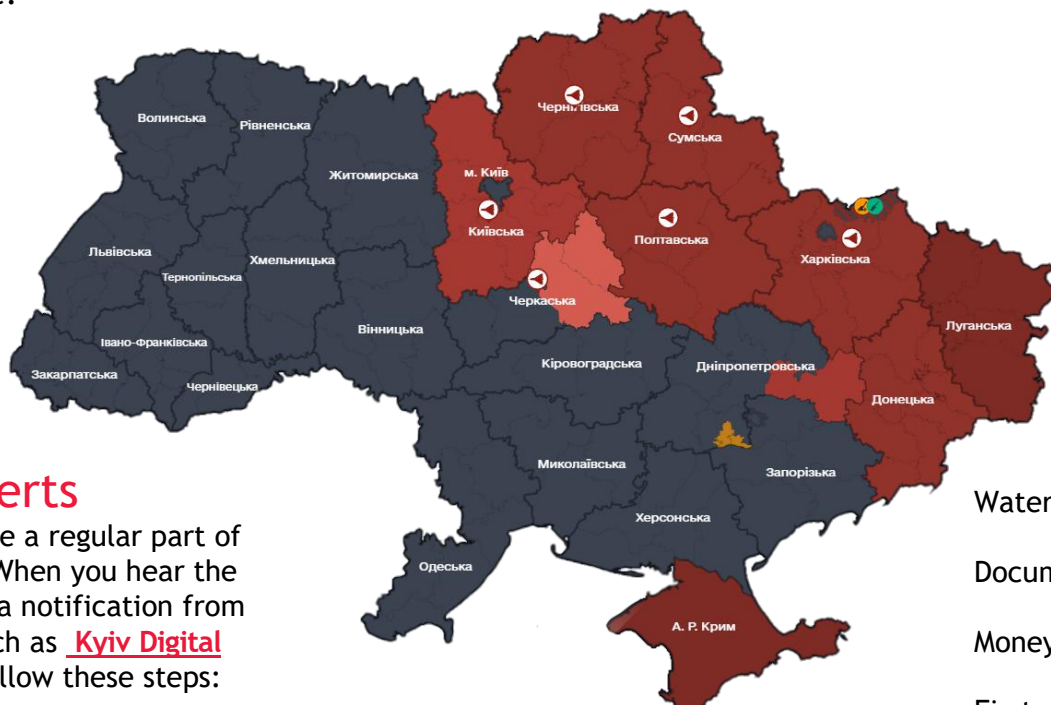

Air raid alerts

Air raid alerts are a regular part of life in Ukraine. When you hear the siren or receive a notification from an alert app (such as [Kyiv Digital](#) or [Air Alarm](#)), follow these steps:

- 1. Go to the nearest shelter immediately** - basements, underground parking lots, underground metro stations or specially marked civil defense shelters. Please note that not everyone go to the shelters, so the decision is ultimately yours.
- 2. If no shelter is nearby**, move to a room without windows (e.g., bathroom or hallway) and follow the “two walls” rule: place at least two walls between you and the outside.
- 3. Take your emergency kit** (“alarm suitcase”) with essentials: documents, water, snacks, flashlight, power bank, first aid items and a whistle.
- 4. Stay in the shelter** until the official all-clear is given, even if you don't hear explosions.
- 5. If caught outside**, lie flat on the ground, preferably in a ditch or depression, and cover you head with your hands.



Please be sure to wear closed shoes, even if you decide to stay in the room.

Mobile network services in Ukraine

Ukraine's mobile network infrastructure is well-developed, providing reliable services for both locals and visitors, even during times of war. In June 2025, a law on a **single roaming zone with the EU** was signed, allowing Ukrainians to use their home operator's tariffs in 27 EU countries without extra fees, with the same conditions for EU users in Ukraine.

Mobile operators

Foreigners can easily access mobile communication and internet through various operators, mainly via prepaid services. Most mobile operators offer convenient **4-week packages**.

There are three main mobile network providers in Ukraine: [Kyivstar](#), [Vodafone](#) and [Lifecell](#). All offer a wide range of plans, including prepaid options, data packages and international calling services. Calls within the same network are usually unlimited when you activate a prepaid package for the next period.

Below you can find a comparison of prepaid tariffs from these mobile operators. Some tariffs offer unlimited access to certain online platforms and messengers. The number of minutes for calls to other mobile operators varies depending on the tariff. Additionally, 4-week packages may

Ukraine does have widespread mobile internet coverage with **2G/3G** and **4G** services available across the country. However, 5G services are not yet fully implemented. The Ukrainian government has started testing 5G networks in three cities, but a full rollout is expected to occur before 2030. The first city where 5G will be fully operational is Lviv.

include minutes for international calls (the amount varies by country). SIM cards can be easily purchased at various locations across Ukraine, including:

- ▶ Railway and bus stations;
- ▶ Mobile operator stores;
- ▶ Shopping malls;
- ▶ Supermarkets, shops and kiosks

Travelers also have a convenient alternative to physical SIM cards — **eSIM**, which can be purchased online or at official stores (the previously mentioned operators offer this service).

National roaming

National roaming in Ukraine allows mobile users to switch between different operators' networks if their primary network is unavailable. This service ensures continuous connectivity, especially in areas where network coverage might be disrupted. Tariffication of services in national roaming is maintained in accordance with the tariff plan of the operator whose services the subscriber uses.

In national roaming, users can use not only voice calls and SMS, but also mobile 2G/3G internet at speeds of up to 512 Kbit/s.

For **lifecell** subscribers, national roaming works automatically. For **Kyivstar** and **Vodafone** subscribers, the automatic option may not be available, so in this case you need to set it up manually by disabling the network autoselection and selecting the available network.

Delivery services in Ukraine

While being in Ukraine or planning a trip to Ukraine, you may need to use a delivery service to send items to different places worldwide. Despite the ongoing war, many delivery services, including international ones, are operating in Ukraine. Within Ukraine, some delivery operators provide next-day delivery to any location where there is a delivery office.



NovaPost is one of the largest and most popular delivery services in Ukraine. You can receive your parcels at branch, pickup point, parcel-locker or specific addresses. It has the most accessible network for customers with over **13,200+** pickup points and **24,000+** parcel lockers across Ukraine. They deliver to more than **200** countries worldwide.

Since 2022 NovaPost has opened branches in **16 countries**: Moldova, Poland, Latvia, Lithuania, Czech Republic, Romania, Germany, Estonia, UK, Slovakia, Hungary, Italy, Spain, Austria, France and Netherlands. The average delivery time abroad is from **3 days** (depending on the country). You can calculate the cost of delivery [HERE](#).



Ukrposhta is Ukraine's national post service, covering 100% of the country's territory (more than **27,000** settlements, except for the temporarily occupied ones). Ukrposhta is a member of the Universal Postal Union and cooperates with 192 national postal operators. This allow you to send items to **660,000** offices in **230+** countries and territories worldwide. You can calculate the cost of your delivery [here](#).



Meest Post is an international delivery service handling parcels, money transfers, and more. Currently, there are over **4,500** Meest branches and **1,500+** parcel lockers operating in Ukraine. You can send and receive items to and from Meest points in Ukraine or Nova Poshta branches worldwide. Meest Post delivers parcels from Ukraine to **70**. The maximum weight of a parcel is **30 kg**. DHL is an international delivery service currently providing limited shipping services in select locations of Ukraine. Operating under elevated risk, additional charges may apply. As of 2025, DHL has not publicly disclosed the number of branches in Ukraine, but the company remains active in providing services. DHL serves **220** countries and territories. 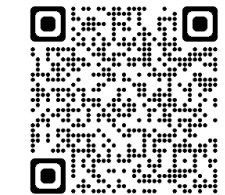
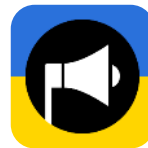
We would like to share some **useful links and apps** with you that could be very helpful while traveling to Ukraine.

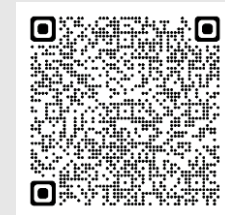

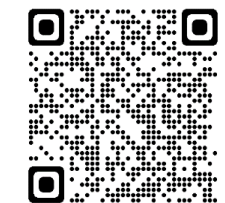

As a direct seller of train tickets, it allows to purchase tickets without any additional fees. Despite various conditions, trains maintain high punctuality with minimal delays. The service is available on the web (also, in English) and in an app format (Ukrainian only).

On November 8th, a new update was released and the **Ukrzaliznytsia** app became integrated with the **Diia** app. Now, purchasing tickets for the popular international train No. 67/68 Kyiv - Warsaw, or returning tickets for international routes bought online, is possible **only after verifying your account through Diia**. The update was introduced to fight ticket scalping. However, foreigners or individuals without the Diia app would not be able to use these new features. Foreigners or Ukrainian citizens without Diia who need to buy a ticket for this train should seek assistance from acquaintances who are Ukrainian citizens with the Diia app installed or use alternative connections.

Koleo is a universal train journey planner that allows you to find the best routes and purchase tickets for trains in Poland. It is available in both Web and App formats.

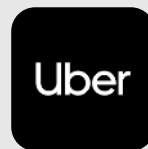
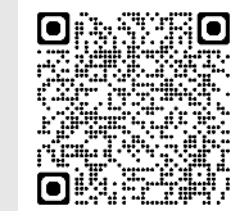

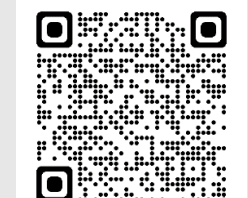
